

# Youth Energy Safe Award

TransCanada, in partnership with the Common Ground Alliance (CGA), would like to recognize youth from not-for-profit organizations such as Boy Scouts of America, Girl Scouts of the U.S.A., 4-H and the National FFA Organization for committing to safe digging practices when undergoing improvement projects in their communities.

TransCanada's goal is to teach the next generation the importance of calling/clicking before digging. Request a locate prior to any project that entails excavating or disturbing the ground in order to protect underground utilities such as gas, water and sewage lines from being damaged. Examples of digging projects include planting trees, shrubs, or flowerbeds, installing a mailbox or fence, or building a deck.

## The Youth Energy Safe Award can be earned by:

- Requesting a locate service for a project in a state where we operate (see [www.TransCanada.com/Maps](http://www.TransCanada.com/Maps)).
- Submitting the completed application form and a W-9 form to [Public\\_Awareness@TransCanada.com](mailto:Public_Awareness@TransCanada.com).
- Once received, the application will be processed for a charitable grant of \$1,000. Please note, this can take up to six weeks.
- Participants are encouraged to share "selfies" and/or photos of their digging projects to be shared on TransCanada's social media.
- When submitting photos, please fill out our photo release form.

## Here's how it works:

- Before digging, call 811 or visit [www.Call811.com](http://www.Call811.com) at least two business days in advance of your project.
- A One-Call representative will ask for the location and details of the project.
- Utility companies will then send a professional locator to the proposed dig site to mark the buried utility lines with marker flags and/or paint.

Remember to carefully dig around the marked areas, not on them. Also, please keep in mind that time, erosion or root growth can shift the locations of underground utility lines. It is important to call for every project regardless of repeated locations.
